Abstract

The main purpose of this research is to assess the role of the development assistance in overcoming the developmental challenges of poverty reduction and protection of environment in Egypt . this is achieved through 1)Identification of national mechanisms for effective development assistance in the area of poverty and environment. 2) Review of the PRSP and its linkage to the Millennium development goals with focus on mainstreaming environmental aspects in this strategy 3)Examining the effectiveness of the donors funded projects in enhancing the quality of life of the community through case study of Geziret El Shier as a poor urban area.
