THE JURY

to find out what the jury has to say about the case. The jury is made up of twelve people who are chosen from the community. They are sworn to be fair and impartial and to follow the instructions of the judge. The jury's job is to listen to the evidence and decide whether the defendant is guilty or not guilty. The jury's decision is called a verdict.

Before the jury can decide on a verdict, the judge will give them instructions. These instructions tell the jury what they need to know about the law and the evidence. The judge will also tell the jury how to go about their work. The jury will then go into a room called a jury room to discuss the case and reach a decision.

After the jury has reached a decision, the judge will call them back into the courtroom. The judge will then ask the jury to read out their verdict. The jury will usually say whether the defendant is guilty or not guilty. If the jury finds the defendant guilty, the judge will then decide on the punishment. The jury's decision is final, and the defendant must accept the verdict.

The jury is an important part of the legal system. It is the jury that decides whether a person is guilty of a crime and what punishment they should receive. The jury is made up of ordinary people from the community, and it is their job to make sure that the law is followed and that justice is done.
