Abstract

Parturients Health Education: It's Effect on Post Cesarean Section Complications

Cesarean section is a major surgical procedure that increases the likelihood of many types of harm for parturient and babies. Aim of the study: to evaluate the effect of parturient health educational program on post cesarean section complications. The study design: A quasi experimental study design **Sample:** purposive included 144 parturient undergoing cesarean section. **The study setting:** The outpatient clinic at Ain shams university, Maternity Hospital. **Tools:** four tools used for data collection, the first tool parturient interviewing questioner; second tool parturient practice checklist; third tool parturient follow up sheet and fourth tool; post cesarean depression assessment tool. **Results**: The finding of this study proved the effect of the health educational program on post cesarean complication through; highly statistical significant relation between total knowledge score level of parturient and total Practice score level pre / post educational program. Highly statistically significant difference between health problem of parturient after cesarean section and their level of health compliance to educational instruction in follow up. Conclusion: Health educational program had a positive efficient on improving parturient knowledge and practice regarding of cesarean section and minimizing post cesarean section complication. **Recommendations:** Based on the results of the study, parturient health educational program must be instituted in all communities with a view to bring about public awareness. Detailed health education programs can be conducted in the hospital set up.
