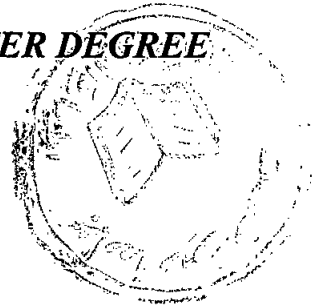
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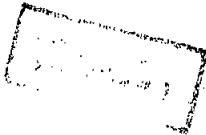
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ABSTRACT

Addiction among anesthesiologists is a serious and unfortunately common problem. The criteria of addiction usually develop in progressive fashion appearing first in the community and lastly at work. Access to drugs, lack of needle taboo and curiosity about drugs are factors that may explain overrepresentation of anesthesiologists in addiction treatment programs.

When suspected, possibility should be investigated. A well planned intervention usually results in agreement of the physician to enter into an addiction treatment program. Reentry into anesthesiology is decided on a case by case basis. Relapse may be lethal.

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
