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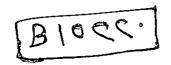


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### "NUTRITIONAL EVALUATION OF SOME CEREAL AND LEGUMES BABY FOODS."

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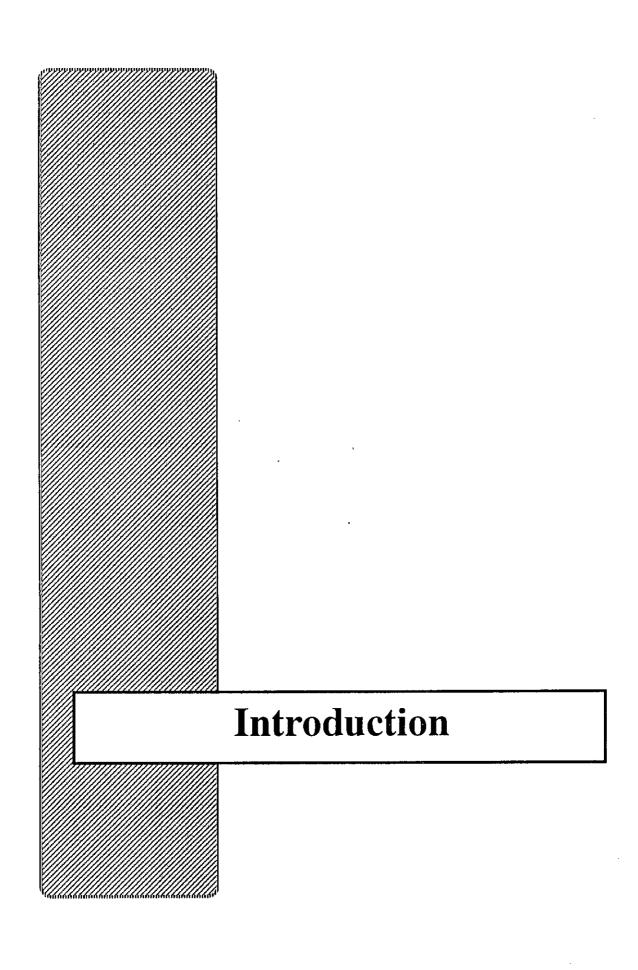
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#### INTRODUCTION

During the first year of infancy the baby grows and develops more rapidly than any other time of his life. He would double his birth weight in the first five months and triple his birth weight by the time of 10-12 months of age. As the body weight might be the product of his nutrition. Immense attention should be devoted to develop good nutritional status particularly to the most vulnerable group of any population. (Jelliffe and Jelliffe., 1979).

Millions of children in developing areas of the world are suffering from malunutrition as a result of poverty, lack of suitable food and incorrect knowledge in nutrition. It is during the rapidly growing period of infancy and early childhood.

The malunutrition and diarrhoea are major factors contributius to the high morbidity and mortality and probably leaving physical and psychological scars in later life in those who survive. (Sobhy, 1983).

In Egypt as stated by Mousa (1990), the weaning period is one of the most critical periods in the infant's life with nutritional problems appearing because traditional weaning foods usually are of low nutrient density, incapable of providing proper energy and nutrient needs.

Weaning foods must bridge the gap between breast-feeding and a family diet. Infant age 6-12 months are a major group of weaning food
