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

INTRODUCTION

I. Preoperative Evaluation

The ultimate goal of preoperative assessment of patients is to reduce the morbidity of surgery. This has been facilitated by the preoperative meeting. This preoperative meeting serves four goals;

- (1) To educate the patient about anaesthesia, preoperative care and pain treatment,
- (2) To obtain information about the patient's medical history, physical and mental conditions to determine which tests and consultations are needed.
- (3) To choose the care plans to be followed, and,
- (4) To obtain informed consent. (1)

The Changing Nature of Preoperative Evaluation

In the past, preoperative assessment was conducted the night before operation, and relied only on accurate history – taking, and physical examination.

Now, Anaesthesiologists "run" from one case to the other and multiphasic screening laboratory tests have been added to the process.
